- Lobby for accelerated gender parity.

Soroptimist International Position Paper:

LEADERSHIP

Soroptimist International is committed to the empowerment of women as leaders and decision makers, yet recognizes that women are consistently underrepresented in positions of leadership. Structural barriers as well as differences in access to resources and capacities render women less likely to achieve leadership positions than their male counterparts.

Women's participation in decision-making at local, national and international levels is a fundamental prerequisite for the realization of equality, sustainable development and peace. Not only does the inclusion of women's voices and a gendered perspective improve their status but works to improve society as a whole.

All women and girls, regardless of their educational attainment, are entitled to have their voices heard and to take on leadership roles in their families, communities and beyond. Soroptimist International urges governments to:

- Endorse the "Women's Empowerment Principles: Equality Means Business" and encourage the private sector to sign up and report on the principles.
- Uphold and implement areas of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women and the Beijing Platform for Action which address the importance of women's representation in and leadership decision making and take notice CEDAW's General Number Recommendation 23 on women in political and public life.
- Support the work of international partnerships such as the Inter-Parliamentarian Union to increase the percentage of women in government.
- Implement efficient methods to augment gender equality in leadership positions.
- Eliminate all forms of violence directed towards women in positions of power or those participating in elections.
- Monitor and report on women's participation in politics and decision making at all levels.
- Adopt UN Women's recommendation to "encourage greater involvement of women who marginalized, may be including indigenous women, women with women from disabilities, rural areas and women of ethnic, cultural or

religious minority, in decision-making at all levels, and address and counter the barriers faced by marginalized women in accessing and participating in politics and decision-making at all levels".

Soroptimist International will continue to:

- Encourage girls from an early age to participate in decisionmaking and to learn the skills necessary to become leaders, championing the SI theme "educate to lead."
- Harness the power of the media and new technologies to promote women's participation in leadership and decision-making.
- Adopt a life course approach to women's participation, working towards a world where women's voices are equally represented throughout their lifetimes.
- Support initiatives which ensure that decision making processes are participatory, responsive, equitable and inclusive.
- Provide educational and leadership opportunities to women and girls to ensure that there is equal access to the capabilities necessary to successfully and confidently take on positions of power and influence.
- Recognize that achieving gender balances in leadership is about all sectors - government, civil service, private sector, political parties, trade unions, the employers' judiciary, organizations, academic institutions and any other

collective which can influence lives.

Soroptimist International:

- Educates society as a whole on the benefits of equal representation of women and men in decision making.
- Empowers women and girls with the skills, confidence and capabilities necessary for taking on leadership and decision-making positions in the family, in their communities, in the private sector, in the public sector and in local, national and international government bodies.
- Enables opportunities for women and girls through lobbying and advocacy for increased representation.


MARCH 6, 2021 LIVE YOUR DREAM: DREAM IT, BE IT CONFERENCE

Our Target Population

Soroptimists believe EVERY woman and girl has a right to live her dream. It's stated in our vision: Women and girls have the resources and opportunities to reach their full potential and live their dreams.

We know all women and girls can face discrimination solely because of their gender. We also know some women and girls face greater challenges because of circumstances that have or could derail their dreams.

Working in countries territories, Soroptimist economically empowers women airls who have faced obstacles such as poverty, violence and teen pregnancy. Through our Dream Programs, Soroptimist provides these women and girls with access to the education and skills training they need to reach their full potential and live their dreams.

We do this work because we believe:

- Some women and girls face specific barriers to reaching their full potential and living their dreams and these are the women and girls who need our help.
- Quality education, more than any other intervention, holds the greatest potential to transform the lives of women and girls.
- Women and girls who have faced obstacles such as poverty, sexual and domestic violence, homelessness, addiction, teen pregnancy and other circumstances are in most need of access to resources and opportunities to reach their full potential and live their dreams.
- Our Dream Programs specifically support the UN Secretary General's call for accelerating women's economic empowerment because they are rooted in the UN agenda for women's equality.
- Our brand-unifying Dream Programs can maximize Soroptimist's impact on these women and girls and

- help us to be better known for our work.
- Our Dream Programs have the highest potential to improve the lives of the women and girls they benefit, and also their families, communities and the world at large.

Who are the specific women and girls we are trying to reach through the Dream Programs?

Live Your Dream Awards: For this award, we seek applicants who have overcome obstacles and are trying to get their lives back on track, build a better life for themselves and their families and lift themselves and their families out of poverty through education and skills training. These women, who have dependents, have overcome obstacles including domestic and sexual violence, teen pregnancy, addiction, health issues, the death of a family member or mental health issues. They want to increase their standard of living but lack the financial resources to access the education and training succeed. Around the world, head of household women have the highest poverty rates. Helping these women improve their education and skills offers them the best chance of improving their lives and the lives of their children—ensuring more positive outcomes for generations to come.

Dream It, Be It: For this program, we seek girls who do not have access to the resources or information they need to adequately plan for their futures. We focus on girls in secondary school who, in most cases, are between the ages of 14 and 18. We aim to empower girls at risk for having their dreams derailed because of obstacles including poverty, unstable home lives,

living in foster care or teen pregnancy. They lack access to professional role models and career education and do not understand the steps needed to accomplish their goals. Helping these girls identify their career goals and path to success will empower them to overcome the barriers they face now and in their future in order to live their dreams.

In order for this strategy to continue to be successful, we must continue to change the way we think and the way that we approach our work. We need to align our resources at every level – club, region and federation – to focus on the Dream Programs because we know our Dream Programs:

- Are evidence-based.
- Create a measurable impact on women and girls.
- Address a need in all of our communities.
- Support the work that matters to us including ending violence against women and girls and lifting them out of poverty.
- Define our impact to a larger audience.
- Appeal to potential members and supporters.
- Attract funders.

Working together, following the same strategy, reaching for the same goals, focusing on our common mission and programs, we can do everything that is important to us including securing the future of Soroptimist for generations to come.
