

NATIONAL DAY OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS

National Human Trafficking Awareness Day in 2025 is on January 11th. This day is also known as #WearBlueDay and it marks the beginning of a month long campaign to raise awareness about human trafficking. To show solidarity and raise awareness, people can wear blue on January 11th. They can also share photos of themselves and others wearing blue on social media using the hashtag #WearBlueDay.

The 2025 theme for Human Trafficking Prevention Month highlights the importance of a holistic approach to preventing human trafficking.

This includes recognizing the intersection of human trafficking with other forms of violence and social issues, building healthy relationships, providing access to resources and fostering economic stability.

The U.S. Congress designated January 11th as National Human Trafficking Awareness Day in 2007.

UpliftHER Initiative: Human Trafficking

Once a quarter, Soroptimist International of the Americas will focus on an obstacle that women and girls face on their path to formal education and economic empowerment. SIA will share information about the obstacle, along with suggested projects that count towards our Big Goal. Clubs can participate in the quarterly project focus by sharing SIA posts and posting their own projects with the hashtag #SoroptimistsUpliftHER.

For January, we will focus on projects that increase access to education for women or girls who have experienced human trafficking. January 11th is recognized as the National Day of Human Trafficking Awareness, making January a meaningful time to learn more about this critical issue and how Soroptimists can help through the Soroptimists UpliftHER initiative.

JANUARY 24, 2025 HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS WORKSHOP



2025. On January 24, Soroptimist International of Riverside (SIR) will host a pivotal dedicated event to raising human awareness about traffickina and fosterina community action against this pervasive issue. As part of National Trafficking Human Awareness Month, this event serves as a beacon of hope and a rallying cry for change.

The campaign to organize this event has been deeply collaborative and transformative. Throughout this process, I've had

the privilege of connecting with remarkable women dedicated to addressing the suffering caused by human trafficking. These partnerships have enriched the campaign and amplified our collective mission to combat this modern day slavery.

The event, titled "Liberation: From Captivity to Resilience and Hope," will take place at the Civil Rights Institute of Southern California in Riverside and will feature:

- Keynote Speaker: Paul Chang, PhD Professor, Student, Advocate and Innovator in Combating Human Trafficking, 25 years of experience, and recipient numerous awards of including the 2019 Global Center for Women and Justice Diamond Award.
- Panel Discussions: Experts and leading voices will provide valuable insights and strategies to combat human trafficking. Survivors, advocates and specialists will engage in powerful conversations to shed light on the complexities of trafficking and potential solutions.
- Resource Workshop: Through an experiential team building attendees exercise, can connect with Professor Chana organizations that and provide support and education combat to trafficking.

This initiative is not just about raising awareness. It is about empowering individuals and communities to take action. Together, we aim to foster resilience, ignite hope and create a future free from the grip of trafficking.

Paul Chang is an adjunct professor at Cal State Los Angeles and Vanguard University. specializes in public He administration and human trafficking. With over 30 years in federal service, he has developed innovative strategies, such as the Enterprise Model, to combat forced labor support and vulnerable populations.

A passionate advocate, Professor Chang grew up undocumented in Monterey Park. He holds a BA and MPA from Cal State LA, where he now teaches. He is pursuing a Ph.D. in Public Policy at Claremont Graduate University and has received numerous awards, including the 2019 Global Center for Women and Justice Diamond Award.

Professor Chang's expertise and commitment to justice make him

an inspiring leader in the fight against human trafficking.

March 15, 2025 Riverside City College

The Live Your Dream Conference Planning Committee met on December 13th and everything continues to move smoothly.

Rosa Santos-Lee has tweaked the applications and flyers for the schools and will be sending them to the districts in January for distribution.

We will be doing a pilot project with Jurupa Valley School District for foster youth recruitment. Once we have established how many foster girls will be attending, Rosa will discuss transportation with the Asst. Superintendent.

Lt. Col. Jengi Martinez, pilot, United States Air Force, has been confirmed as the morning speaker. Our own Dr. Tiffanie Tate will be the afternoon speaker.

The facility is secured for March 15, 2025, with a fee waiver. However, we will have to pay \$934 for staff costs on the day of the event. It has also been confirmed that we can use five classrooms in the new building by the cafeteria.

We have more than 150 backpacks currently on hand so we do not need to purchase additional backpacks this year. However, we may need to purchase additional lanyards.

JoAnn Moore is overseeing the Collage Project (aka Vision Boards). All members can contribute by sending photos, motivational words and quotes, etc., to JoAnn.

We intend to use SI Riverside members for security so we will need volunteers.

And lastly, Susan Exon is looking into a grant from Soroptimist International of the Americas. The SIA grant program application process opened on December 1st.
